## **ENGLISH**



The Environmental Scout Centre Kočevski Rog (SOC) is located at the edge of the virgin forest Rajhenavski Rog in the southern part of Slovenia. The main mission of the centre is the development and passing on of an environmental awareness consciousness through the implementation of the scout method.

Groups visiting the Environmental Scout Centre can choose from several different programmes: environmental workshops, wilderness survival workshops, excursions, sporting activities, etc.



The entirely renovated house offers 40 beds, a fully equipped kitchen, a dining room, a big community room, 4 bunkrooms, toilets and showers. The house has its own water reservoir and central heating.

The camping site in the vicinity of the house can accommodate up to 60 campers.

SCOUTING ENVIRONMENTAL EDUCATION IS BASED ON EXPERIENCING THE NATURE, WHICH LEADS TO AN ACTIVE AND RESPONSIBLE ATTITUDE TOWARDS THE ENVIRONMENT.

With its unique location in the middle of untouched nature, the Environmental Scout Centre serves as an excellent starting point for exploring and discovering innumerable natural and cultural sights in its surroundings.

- Fir, the Queen of Rog having sprouted from a tiny seed 500 years ago, the tree is now already 51 metres tall.
- Prelesnikova koliševka Cave— 40-metre-high
  precipitous rock face with a distinct hollow
  characterised by a chill spell on the bottom and rich
  vegetation usually found in the cold of an alpine
  climate.
- Peak Veliki Rog the highest peak of the Kočevje
  Highlands (1099 m) with an outlook tower offering a
  beautiful view over near and far surroundings in nice
  weather conditions.
- Virgin forest Rajhenavski Rog a kingdom of hundredyear-old trees providing living space to rare and autochthonic plant and animal species.
- Ice cave Ledena jama pri Kunču a cave containing perennial ice that can be several metres thick at the bottom of the cave.
- Abandoned Gottscheer villages (Podstenice, Trnovec, Rajhenav, Ribnik, Resa, etc.)
- Žaga Rog remains of what was once the biggest wood-industry plant in Slovenia that used to employ up to 350 employees at its peak.
